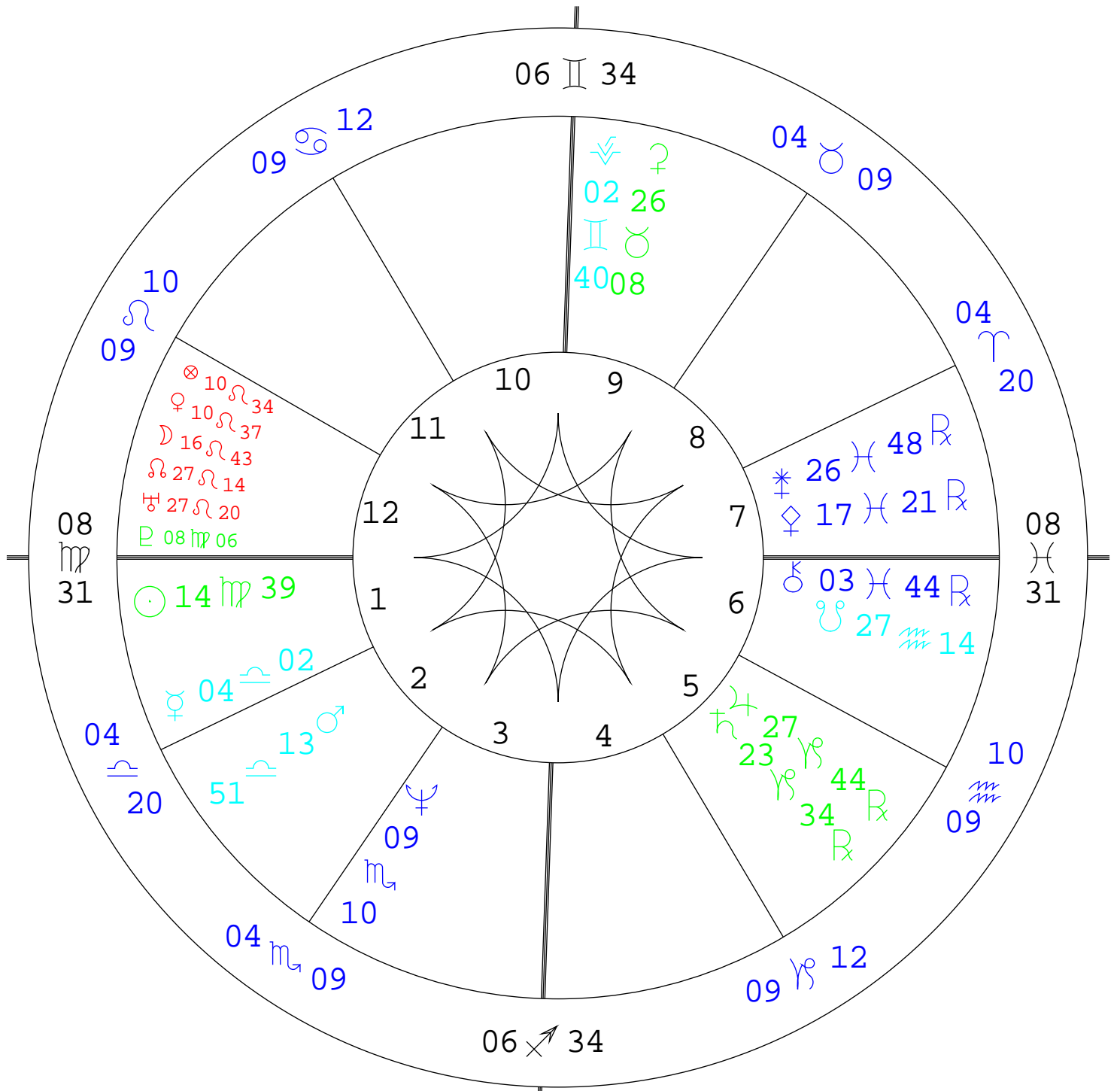

Introduction

The **Professional Profile** is designed to help you explore your vocational options. Several books have been written on the topic of "Do what you love and the money will follow." While that may not be true for every single field, life often works out that way. More significantly, one's career is a major source of personal recognition and self-esteem. People who feel terrible about what they do are risking their mental and physical health. (Frustration can lead to many destructive results.) In contrast, if you are turned on by your job, you have more energy, and more joy for life in general.

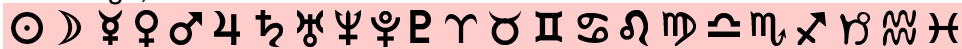
The earlier sections of this profile will look at what you are suited for vocationally in detail. This includes potential talents and abilities as well as character traits which might present challenges on the job. Also included will be suggestions of general career categories and some specific examples just to spark your thinking. What is likely to be financially, as well as personally, rewarding is part of these discussions.

Thanks are given to Jamie Binder. Many of the suitable professions listed are discussed in her book, *Planets in Work: A Complete Guide to Vocational Astrology* and based on her years of experience as a vocational astrologer.

The final sections will give quick, shorthand summaries of the major issues you need to consider in order to have a satisfying career. Some people prefer to read those first, and come back to the more detailed material later. The choice is yours.

In all sections, the material appears in order of significance. Those items which are most meaningful in your horoscope are discussed first. Some Profiles will have many, many themes and possibilities. (Such people can pursue many different professions.) If, however, you wish to limit your focus (information overload!), concentrate on the first two, three or four items discussed in each section.

Our aim is to help you take an objective look at what you have going for yourself as a worker. If we can uncover abilities you hadn't suspected, reaffirm a direction you were considering, point out a way to turn a "liability" into an asset, or validate your self-esteem, productivity and accomplishments--then this **Profile** is a success. And you will be as well!



Career Basic Nature

Astrology does not say you would be uniquely suited for one specific career; most people have aptitudes in a number of different areas. Astrology mirrors inner motivations and drives which function best in certain kinds of fields, certain working environments. Knowing ourselves better enables us to choose careers which are most fully satisfying.

This section focuses on the themes which are strongly emphasized as potential areas of talent and ability for you. Some specific suggestions are given as examples, but your primary focus should be on the personality characteristics mentioned. For greatest vocational satisfaction, seek fields which showcase the qualities discussed within this section.

Remember that the character descriptions are printed in order of importance for you. The one that has the most weight in your chart is printed first, the one with the second-most weight next, and so on.

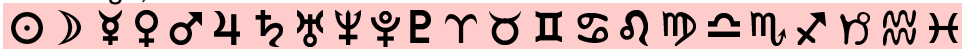
Also, if a character description is extremely significant in your chart it is printed in ***bold-italic***. If a particular theme is highly significant in your chart, that theme is printed in *italic*. If your horoscope has an analysis which is significant, that analysis appears in regular type. The decision on significance is made by comparing the patterns in your chart to the average frequency of occurrence from 10,000 charts.

The Noteworthy Worker

You need to shine in your work! In some way, your career should involve being on stage, the center of attention and receiving admiration, appreciation and applause in some form. It is a place to allow expression of your creativity. It is a place to gain self-esteem and a healthy sense of pride in your accomplishments. Positive response to your vocational attainments is vital. You may gain renown, notice, or even fame within your profession.

We all need appreciation, but be sure you are not too dependent on other people responding to and approving of what you do. Feeling good about yourself only because you have "performed" well on the job is an uncomfortable state of affairs. If you are too ego-vulnerable, you may fear trying certain things, because you hate to "lose" and would rather not try (at times) than risk being laughed at or put down. If you trust in your natural magnetism and drive, you can accomplish much.

Potential talents range from teaching, acting, sales, promotion,



advertising to the entertainment world in any form or speculation and gambling. You have an instinct for risk-taking in your work, an urge to somehow expand, hit the "big time," do more than has been done before. Whether you risk money (gambling and speculation), your ego (entertainment), your time and persuasive ability (sales, teaching), the hope is that you will get a bigger and better return on your investment!

One possible way to express your creativity is through having and raising children. You could make a career out of working with children (your own or other people's) or you could be drawn to fields involving recreation, play or childlike zest and enthusiasm. You might also work with a special loved one. Your urge to pour out into the world can express through love as well as other emotionally exciting avenues.

Since it is essential for you to be important in your work, you do not function as comfortably in a subsidiary position. You are best off running the show. Your natural dynamism makes you less inclined to wait in the wings while others direct the action. This might incline you toward a managerial or supervisory role. If you deny this "royal" part of your inner motivations, you will continually attract prima donnas on the job--people who refuse to ever get offstage, self-centered egotists who believe the whole world revolves around them.

You prefer excitement and action in your work. This may mean you are reluctant to settle for an "ordinary" job or something less than the best. Carrying through on boring details is **not** your forte; you prefer to delegate that to someone else. Your most significant talent is the ability to touch the inner child in all people. You can get other people excited and involved. This gives you ability in working with children in many fields (teaching, coaching, Little League...), in recreation (getting people to loosen up and have fun) and in any kind of promotional or creative field. Your dramatic instincts help you to sway people and have an impact. You're a natural leader.

The Visionary Worker

The central theme here is inspiration which tends to be lived out in three major roles: the professional artist, the professional helper and/or the professional victim. All are seeking their own version of the beautiful dream, infinite ecstasy. The artist is inspired by a cosmic vision and is trying to bring it into being here on Earth. The helper/healer/savior has utopian ideals about the best of all possible worlds and is striving to help create that here on Earth, by assisting others in leading more fulfilling and fulfilled lives or by creating a better world. The victim also has a dream



but is unwilling or feels unable to do anything about it. So, the victim retreats (into drugs, alcohol, illness, fantasy, sleeping all the time, etc.) to escape from the fact that the world is **not** perfect and s/he is not doing anything to change it!

The artist could function in any of the beauty fields--including creating it with his/her own body or through any art form. Besides standard "beauty" fields such as painting, photography, music, design and singing, other forms of the aesthetic could be expressed. The world of film, enacting fantasies and offering ideal visions, might be a focus. Glamour, romance, dreams, mystery and illusion could be part of the picture. Beauty can also be expressed with food, clothing, cosmetics, landscape gardening. The possibilities are endless.

The savior could be in the medical, counseling, astrological or any other vocation which involves assisting people in living more satisfying lives. The victim could choose any form of escapism. A temptation professional helpers have to resist is becoming too involved with the saving role. Sacrificing too much turns the savior into victim. Knowing how much to give, when to give, and how to give is important.

The yearning for a connection to the Infinite is tied to your handling of the physical world. You could be drawn to fields involving the small (microbiology, miniatures) or the infinitely boundless (e.g., astronomy). This "ideal work" theme can manifest as the search for the perfect job (with disillusionment when it is less than ideal and perhaps going from job to job--hoping the next one will be more ideal). Or, the person may attempt to be godlike and perfect--never making a mistake, an inhuman demand. One victim variation is waiting for God to do the work--expecting somehow that everything will fall in your lap like manna from heaven! Other alternatives include a career that satisfies your ideals, that improves the world, or an idealization of doing a good job. Your intuition could be an asset in your work.

The worst of this combination is never being satisfied because the real world falls short of your inspired vision. The best of this combination is continually working, on a practical level, to help create your beautiful dream and make it an actuality.



Challenges and Talents

The short and simple explanation of this section is that the paragraphs listed under "Challenges" and "Talents" are in order of significance. The first few Challenges listed are likely to be the most significant; the first few Talents listed are likely to be particularly meaningful.

Bear in mind that the older you are, or the better you know yourself, the more likely that you have mastered your Challenges and turned them into additional Talents.

(If you wish to understand more about the astrological bases of what is depicted below, read the rest of this introduction. If you do not care about the astrology, skip over the rest of this introduction.)

The aspects (angular relationships) between planets indicate how well (or ill) certain drives within you get along. Harmony aspects tend to symbolize talents and abilities (although we can also overdo in those areas). Conflict aspects show internal conflicts, where one side of our nature wants one thing, and another side wants something different. In such cases, we must compromise (a bit of both) or learn to take turns between the different impulses. Once we have integrated conflict aspects, they point to areas of increased strength where we are more capable than we were before. (Just as we build physical muscles through the tension and resistance of working out with weights, so we can build emotional, mental and spiritual muscles through working out with these internal issues.) The older you are, the more likely you have developed strength and competence in areas covered by the challenges listed here.

The aspects discussed include:

1. All the inner "planets" (Sun, Moon, Mercury, Venus, Mars) to all the other planets (as these aspects are particularly personal).
2. Saturn aspects to other planets (because Saturn is a major key to one's career and contribution to society).
3. Aspects to the Ascendant and Midheaven (because the Ascendant is a major symbol of personal action and the Midheaven denotes career goals and drives).
4. Aspects from Ceres and Vesta, the "work" asteroids, to the other planets.

Aspects to Saturn show issues that you will often share with everyone in your peer group (born within a few weeks or, sometimes, even months



of you). So, Saturn aspects may not be as personally relevant as some of the others.

However, any aspects which are particularly "tight" (close in orb) in your chart are quite meaningful. If you ordered your report with astrological annotation, the orb of each aspect is given in the heading when the aspect is named. Without annotation, the report does not tell you which aspect is being interpreted. In either case, the aspect delineations are printed in order of closeness of orb (closest first). You should give the themes listed first the most weight.

Each aspect is discussed in terms of its symbolism for work potentials. This includes personality tendencies which could affect your vocational success as well as talents and/or abilities which would suggest certain specific careers. Please bear in mind that any examples given are just that. Always think in terms of related fields. There are over 20,000 jobs listed by the Department of Labor. Obviously, we cannot cover them all! We provide examples to help spur your thinking and associations.

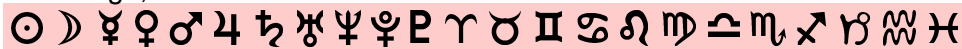
CHALLENGES

Eager Intellect _____
Mercury quincunx Chiron Orb 0°18' _____

An active, restless and eager mind is suggested. Your intellectual skills could be an asset in many different fields. 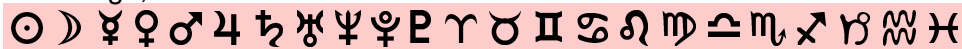

A bit of both will work the best for you. Your mental acuity and innovative attitudes can provide a good balance to your dedicated desire for efficiency and careful analysis. You can do work that employs both your feeling for exactitude and your quest for intellectual challenges. You could rise to the role of expert in many areas.

Venus square Neptune Orb 1°27'

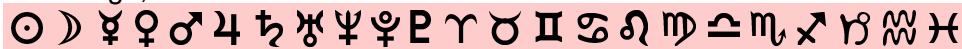
Your inner desire for the beautiful dream might challenge your handling of finances and/or love relationships. You must find a constructive outlet for your inspired, compassionate side--without succumbing to the lure of escapism (e.g., through drugs or alcohol) or trying to be all things to all people. You may be susceptible to seeing what you want to see in terms of finances and colleagues--rather than what is there. You could "space out" rather than balancing the checkbook. You could be a "sucker" for a sob story. You could fall into codependent or savior/victim relationships in terms of finances. You might overvalue material goods (or deny them any importance). You could make money through art, counseling, consulting, relationships, idealistic activities, etc. You must balance the quest for infinite perfection with practical assessments of the real world and its necessities.

Look Beneath The Surface

Debts or taxes could be a focus in your work. Obsessiveness may affect your capacity to produce. Clashes are possible with business or other partners until compromise is achieved. Secrecy or hidden matters may be significant in your vocation. You might be either too compulsive or not thorough enough on the job. Money may be used as a form of power by you, or others toward you at work.

You may face the dark side of life (and yourself) or be fascinated by it in colleagues. Your mate may seem to separate you from your work (or vice versa). Vocational compromises are a challenge for you. You are learning when to take control and when to be an equal on the job. Unconscious emotional needs may affect your drive for success; stay aware. You are learning to deal wisely with your intensity at work.



Balancing Drive & Caution

Your personal desires may conflict with authorities until you learn to figure out the rules and work within them. You are learning not to hit the stone wall of reality--but also not to give up **too** soon. Your first impulse might not always be the best career wise; practice planning and seeing the positive and negative to every situation. You may take on too much (or too little) responsibility; a balance is best for your health and vocational success. You need work in which you can be self-directed. You have lots of energy for accomplishment as long as you are doing it **your** way.

Graceful

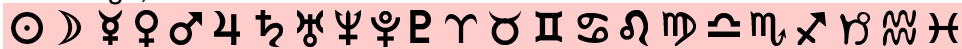

You can be quite hardworking and helpful. Your willingness to exert yourself could be a vocational asset in many different fields. You will do what is necessary to get the job done--and done well. You probably have



organizational skills and talent for handling details. (Because you have a talent for seeing the flaws, wanting the correct and improve everything--you may occasionally overdo critical judgment. Generally, however, you are eager to enhance, repair and raise the efficiency level of everything you are involved with.) You may have executive ability, with a natural drive to reach the top or to seek the role of expert and authority. Your practical focus could lead you toward science, business or any realm where tangible results are evident.

Great Teacher

This combination is said to symbolize the "Great Teacher"--one who combines wisdom and practicality or the spirit and the letter of the law. Feelings of justice may be highlighted, along with a desire to make visions a reality. The role of teacher (and preacher) is a natural.

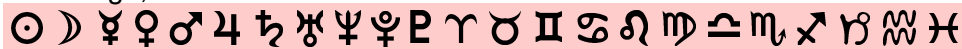
Your career might involve education, travel, writing, philosophy, education, religion, law or anything involving ideas, ideals and a larger perspective. You might incline toward idealizing the work ethic (which can lead to the workaholic) or seeking the "ideal" job (perfect hours, pay, colleagues, etc.)--a recipe for dissatisfaction. Another alternative is to work for a more perfect world--inspiring, informing or uplifting people in some fashion.

You could deal with business on a large scale and are probably able to pursue growth slowly and patiently. You are capable of blending a number of polarities for optimal functioning: expansion and contraction; optimism and pessimism; ease and effort; risk and safety; future and past. Alert for opportunities, you can be the practical idealist, able to structure and solidify long-term goals. You are likely to be industrious, resilient, protective, honorable and generally successful.

More Challenges and Talents

Some horoscopes will emphasize additional challenges and/or talents in terms of work. This section will summarize any additional potentials. If any words appear in **boldface**, it is because those issues (whether challenges or talents) are repeated, and therefore doubly emphasized, in your horoscope.

This section examines any aspects involving planets which rule your



"work" houses (the 2nd, 6th, and 10th). Each planet is said to "rule" a particular sign or signs. When the sign a planet rules is on the cusp of a house, the planet also is said to "rule" that house. Following are brief summaries of the potentials suggested by aspects to any rulers of your work houses.

Ruler of 10th (Mercury) quincunx Chiron Orb 0°18'

Ruler of 6th (Uranus) quincunx Jupiter Orb 0°24'

Ruler of 6th (Uranus) quincunx Juno Orb 0°32'

Ruler of 6th (Uranus) square Ceres Orb 1°12'

Ruler of 2nd (Venus) square Neptune Orb 1°27'

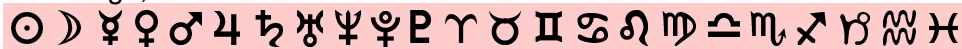
There may be additional vocational challenges which require you to master the following qualities...pioneering instincts, eagerness to learn, confidence; promotional skills, recognition of opportunities, optimism; interpersonal skills, feeling for beauty, team spirit; competence, dedication, assisting instincts; visualizing skills, imagination, artistic abilities. (Once you have mastered them, you are even stronger and more able in those areas.)

There may be additional vocational challenges faced through working out a resolution with the following individual(s)...a teacher or mentor, a maverick, others in a network; "luck" or opportunity knocking, a good-humored, optimistic person; a spouse, partner, consultant or friend; a parent, colleague or nurturing person; a mysterious or hidden source, an artistic or idealistic person.

Ruler of 10th (Mercury) trine Vesta Orb 1°23'

There is additional vocational talent implied in terms of your...efficiency skills, ability to handle details, repairing instincts.

You might receive vocational assistance from...a colleague or former critic.



Suitable Professions

This section is designed to list general job categories in which you may have talent. Some specific examples will also be given. Please remember that we cannot list all 20,000 jobs compiled by the U.S. Department of Labor. Use this list to do additional brainstorming on your own.

Each set of job categories is under the heading of a particular planet. This simply means that the planet(s) listed were prominent (or their houses or signs were strongly occupied) in your horoscope. Unless you are interested in learning astrology, you can ignore the planet name and simply focus on your listings. The general categories are in **boldface** type. A few examples are provided for each category. The final example for each planet (**Mundane**) refers to the literal objects or products associated with each planet. Sometimes your career will involve the things or people listed in that category. Give most emphasis, however, to the qualities listed. It is not possible for us to cover all the specific possibilities.

Some people will have many, many possibilities listed here. They are those lucky (or overwhelmed?) souls who can do almost anything! If, however, you are looking for a narrow focus, remember that this section lists Suitable Professions in order of significance. Those listed first are most emphasized in your horoscope. If you have many, many profession groups listed, you may initially want to look at only the first one or two.

Also, if anything appears in *italics*, those possibilities are highly emphasized in your chart. Anything in regular type still registers well above average for you.

Neptune Professions

Artistic/Glamorous: advertiser, musician, dancer, painter, make-up, fashion, magician, actor, director or anyone in film industry.

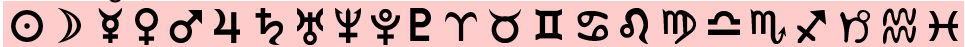
Intuition/Compassion: astrologer, nurse, podiatrist, anesthesiologist or any hospital worker, psychic, therapist, anyone helping the less fortunate.

Religious/Spiritual: clergy, Habitat for Humanity, charitable work, metaphysics or any religious or spiritual work.

Infinite: virology, genetics, astronomy, oceanography, physics.

Underlying patterns: any of the sciences, poet, ecologist, sociologist, historian.

Unconscious/Escapist: psychologist, bartender or anyone involved with the liquor or wine industry, counselor on addictions; drug manufacturer



or sales representative.

Mundane: art, asylums, chemicals, communes, confinement, cosmos, disguises, dissolving, distilling, dreams, fears, feet, drugs, liquids, magic, oil, mysteries, utopias.

Jupiter Professions

Big time: venture capitalist, investor in stocks or commodities, politics, journalist, anyone well-known or wielding strong influence (VIP).

Education/Inspiration: professor, anyone working for a college or university, author, publisher.

Faraway places: import/export business, travel agent or writer, pilot, flight attendant, foreign correspondent, explorer, adventurer, astronaut, sailor, ambassador.

Ideals: preacher, metaphysician, philosopher, judge, lawyer, clergy, reformer, consumer or other advocate or ombudsman, social activist, philanthropist.

Mundane: abundance, foreign countries, courts, endowments, fat, good fortune, growth, horses, thighs, liver, luck, publishing, religion.

Sun Professions

Onstage: actor or actress, salesperson, teacher, theatrical manager or producer, advertiser or someone in public relations, anyone in the entertainment industry or performing arts.

Speculative: gambler, investor, promoter, stockbroker, financier, prosperity trainer, entrepreneur, developer.

Leading/Cheering: executive, manager, trainer, coach; anyone in a leadership capacity, or providing motivation, encouragement and praise to others.

Playful: producing, inventing, selling or working with toys or games; circus owner or worker; playground director; anything with children, sports, or recreation industry.

Romantic: novels, movies, working someone you love.

Mundane: casinos, cruises, entertainment, gold, heart, resorts, sun, fame.

Uranus Professions

Unusual: astrologer, astronaut, metaphysician, astronomer, UFOlogist, writer for **National Enquirer** or any field that is considered unconventional.

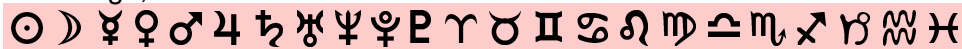
