## INTRODUCTION

People are of varying temperaments, energy levels and tastes, so it is not possible for us to predict, on the basis of a wedding date alone, what is the best type of day for you. What we **can** give you here is a general interpretation of the astrological themes of that day.

You will need to read the interpretations to see if this particular day fits your personal expectations. Some couples, for example, want a lively, exciting wedding, while others would prefer a quiet, serious one.

Your **Wedding Report** is based on the city and time zone which are written at the top of this page. If you will be getting married in a different city than the one listed and the time zone is different, you would have to adjust the times listed in this report.

Example: Tiffany and Brad live in New York City and are marrying in November, so their Wedding report was run for Eastern Standard Time and mailed to them in New York. They are planning their marriage, however, for Los Angeles (due to relatives), so they must adjust any times given in their report 3 hours earlier--as Los Angeles is three hours earlier than New York City.

An astrologer selecting a time for a wedding considers many factors, including the birth horoscopes of each person (based on your birthplace, birthdate and birth time) in comparison with a proposed chart for the wedding. It is a complex procedure, which should not be confused with this generalized interpretation of the day only.

In the method of astrology used to study events, the aspects made by the swiftly-moving Moon are very important. The Moon aspects which take place **before** the time you have set for your wedding are not so significant as those **after** the time you have set for your wedding. Aspects before the wedding signify what has already occurred, while aspects after the time of your wedding represent what lies ahead. THE LAST ASPECT OF THE MOON BEFORE IT LEAVES A SIGN IS PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT, even if it occurs the day after your wedding, as that aspect is said to be "the end of the matter" and therefore may tell something about the eventual course of your relationship. Pay close attention to the general nature of that aspect and consider whether it seems appropriate for your personalities, what you want for your relationship, and for your wedding day.



All aspects between planets are listed as **active** or **passive**. Active aspects will most likely be evident and can be challenging or positive, depending on the particular planets involved. Pay close attention to those interpretations. Passive aspects will reflect the mood of the day, but are unlikely to indicate overt problems. Consider them contributing factors, but not as important as the active aspects.

The **sign** the Moon is in is quite meaningful. Ideally, the Moon sign should reflect images and tendencies which fit your personalities and the sort of wedding you wish to experience.

If, in particular, the sign of the Moon and the aspects it will form **after** the time of your wedding sound mostly like the kind of wedding you would want, you have chosen a good day! Don't worry if there are one or two challenging aspects as long as there are others which sound good to you; it is a rare day that offers **no** challenges. The interpretations include suggestions for making the most of the aspects of the day you have chosen.

**The Moon is in Taurus until 9:34 am.** \_\_\_\_\_

A good day for a bountiful wedding feast! This sign of the Moon favors stability, caution, material security, quiet sensuality, and appreciation for the beauty and bounty of the Earth. A caveat: people could be bull-headed, so tread warily if stubbornness is a factor of concern within your relationship. Physical possessions may be quite important to you. The focus is on pleasure, affection and simple comforts in your marriage.

**The Moon makes a passive aspect to the North Node at 2:09 am.** \_\_\_\_\_

An accent on your harmonious emotional connections with family, relatives, friends, those with whom you have strong affinity. Suggestive of a big wedding, or of a relationship that involves much contact with others or with the public. Suggests a sense of protection, kinship and emotional safety.

**The Moon is Void of Course from 2:09 am to 9:34 am.** \_\_\_\_\_

The period of time during which the Moon is Void of Course can be an ambiguous one for new projects. If you have not already firmed your wedding plans, we recommend that you **not** schedule your wedding during this time. Rather, conclude the ceremony **before** the final aspect



of the Moon in a sign (before it goes Void of Course) or wait until **after** the Moon enters the next sign.

Void of Course cautions are not essential, however, when an enterprise (or a marriage) has been planned for a long time and all the details worked out. If much preparation and care has gone into your wedding plans and the time period includes a Void of Course, do not be concerned. Know that your care and commitment will carry the day.

**The Moon enters Gemini at 9:34 am.** \_\_\_\_\_

Communication is emphasized in your relationship, and on this wedding day. People are talkative, spontaneous, inquisitive, perhaps witty but also may be restless, nervous or inconsistent. This day could be a good choice if you want a lively, sociable reception, but not so good if one or both of you have a tendency to be nervous or high strung. The focus is on communication, learning and lightheartedness in your marriage.

**The Sun makes an active aspect to Pluto at 11:18 am.** \_\_\_\_\_

Intense emotions are accentuated today, with a willingness to bare the depths of your soul to another. If either of you is too strong-willed, power struggles or strife over money and sexuality are possible. Yet the positive potential is an emotional commitment beyond all others.

**The Moon makes a passive aspect to Neptune at 7:53 pm.** \_\_\_\_\_

Emphasizes imagination, inspiration, dreaminess. Heightens emotional sensitivity, intuition, vulnerability. A relaxing influence on the wedding day; an aura of idealism about the relationship. Potential of tuning in easily to one another's emotions in your relationship. Grace and beauty refresh you both.

**The Moon makes an active aspect to Venus at 1:01 am the next day.** -

Any Moon/Venus aspect emphasizes love, romance and social gatherings, so this is a fine indicator of your wedding day, though it could reflect some conflicting moods. Parental themes may vie with partnership needs. Surely there will be lots of hugs, shows of affection and pleasure.

**The Moon makes an active aspect to Pluto at 4:04 am the next day.** —

Emotions are very intense, desires are strong. At best, an aspect of transformation; at worst, an indicator of manipulation or power struggle. If



Mother wants to run the ceremony, you'd better give in gracefully, or pick another day. Potential jealousy in your relationship, yet also the option of a intimate bond deeper and closer than most.

**The Sun makes an active aspect to the Moon at 5:14 am the next day.**

You have chosen the time of the New Moon--traditionally associated with new beginnings and an auspicious choice for a wedding. Loving feelings are highlighted with contentment, vitality and emotional warmth in focus. It becomes doubly important that the sign the Moon is in now be compatible for you as a couple--because the Sun is there as well.

**The Moon makes a passive aspect to Uranus at 6:50 pm the next day.**

Excitement and energy in the air. Favors a ceremony that is inventive and original, and a free-spirited couple who thrive on spontaneity. (Unsettling if you take yourselves and the perfect details of your ceremony too seriously; expect the unexpected.) Within your relationship you must honor the freedom and independence needs of each of you.

**The Moon makes an active aspect to Mars at 7:03 pm the next day.**

Emotions are charged, and possibly impulsive. An elopement? No? Well, OK if you're on the same wavelength, potentially troublesome if you're not. An aspect of sexual attraction, but could indicate emotional conflicts. Being direct and forthright in expressing feelings works best in your marriage.
